### OUR BAPTISMAL FONT ARRIVES THIS WEEK

The arrival of the new Baptismal Font is scheduled for September 8th! The flooring around the font will be laid after the font is in the space. With the new Sacred Baptismal Environment and the removal of the balcony, we now have the opportunity to fully view our Holy Family Stained Glass window. Along with the natural light flowing through the two new windows to either side, it will truly continue to be a welcoming, holy and sacred space.



The new flooring/porcelain tile has been laid all through the front half of the church. We are still awaiting the carpeting for the sanctuary steps. When we move back into the church, the sanctuary area will still be concrete for approximately two weeks.

The pew reinstatement is scheduled to happen around Sept. 9. The kneelers will then be placed back onto each pew. The screens, projectors and cameras are in place and testing is in progress.



The 'step-up' to our new Reconciliation Room as been eliminated. Easy access to the chapel will afford parishioners a place to reflect before and after the time in confession. The chairs, confessional screen, kneeler and painting will be completed in the coming days and we hope that it will be ready for the Sacrament of Reconciliation next weekend.

It has been a very exciting year for the Worship Leadership Team. We assisted in facilitation of Christmas Liturgies, Lenten Prayer, Holy Week Liturgies, Mass with Bishop Clark in June, Liturgical minister formation and mentoring, coordination of weekend Masses, and have been working with the construction team and architects this summer with Phase One—A Mission Driven People, to offer expertise in various parts of our worship space renovation.

## St. Joseph School News

---



St. Joseph School recently benefited from the generous donation of the contents of a warehouse that changed owners. It was like Christmas in August, largely because no one knew exactly what and how much would be arriving on two flatbed trucks. What was really a pleasant sight were the more than two-dozen parents and teachers and just as many students and former St. Joseph students who answered Sister Christina's call to help unpack the trucks, which were loaded with notebooks, paper supplies, carnival prizes and even baby supplies that someone immediately suggested could be donated to a number of the church's ministries.

What made the several-hour project more enjoyable were the conversations among the children and teachers as they spoke of the coming school year and the exchanges among the adults, which often start with small talk of "busy schedules" but, because of the time between deliveries, expanded into many areas. One father went back to school to seek an advanced degree, another mother shared her adventures of visiting colleges with her daughter and Sister Christina entertained several parents with a story about the time she was interviewed by the Secret Service who were seeking information on a prospective employee. "I made a few jokes," she said. "They didn't laugh." And then we all laughed. The day ended with one mother inviting nearly a dozen third- and fifth-grade boys to her family cottage on Lake Ontario for some fun in the sun and a swim in the lake.
